This individual will be responsible for implementing and conducting tobacco cessation group programs for the Young Adults Tobacco Project which targets 18-25 year olds. This project is funded by the Philadelphia Department of Public Health (PDPH) as part of the City's Putting Prevention to Work Program. Project activities include outreach to Philadelphia community organizations that target and serve young adults and implementation/facilitation of 6-week cessation programs into the ongoing services of those partner organizations.

Master's degree or bachelor's degree with 3-5 years of highly relevant experience in public health and/or social services is required. Of particular interest is experience in dealing with diverse populations, facilitation of group work and an interest in public health practice.

Current funding expires March 17, 2011; continued funding beyond grant period by PDPH is in discussion.

Qualified candidates will have 3-5 years of proven experience with the following skills:

- Community outreach, education and/or therapeutic group facilitation
- Ability to work with young adult urban clients
- Excellent oral and written communication skills
- Proficiency in use of PC
- Ability to use sound, independent judgment
- Ability to handle multiple, complex tasks with minimal supervision
